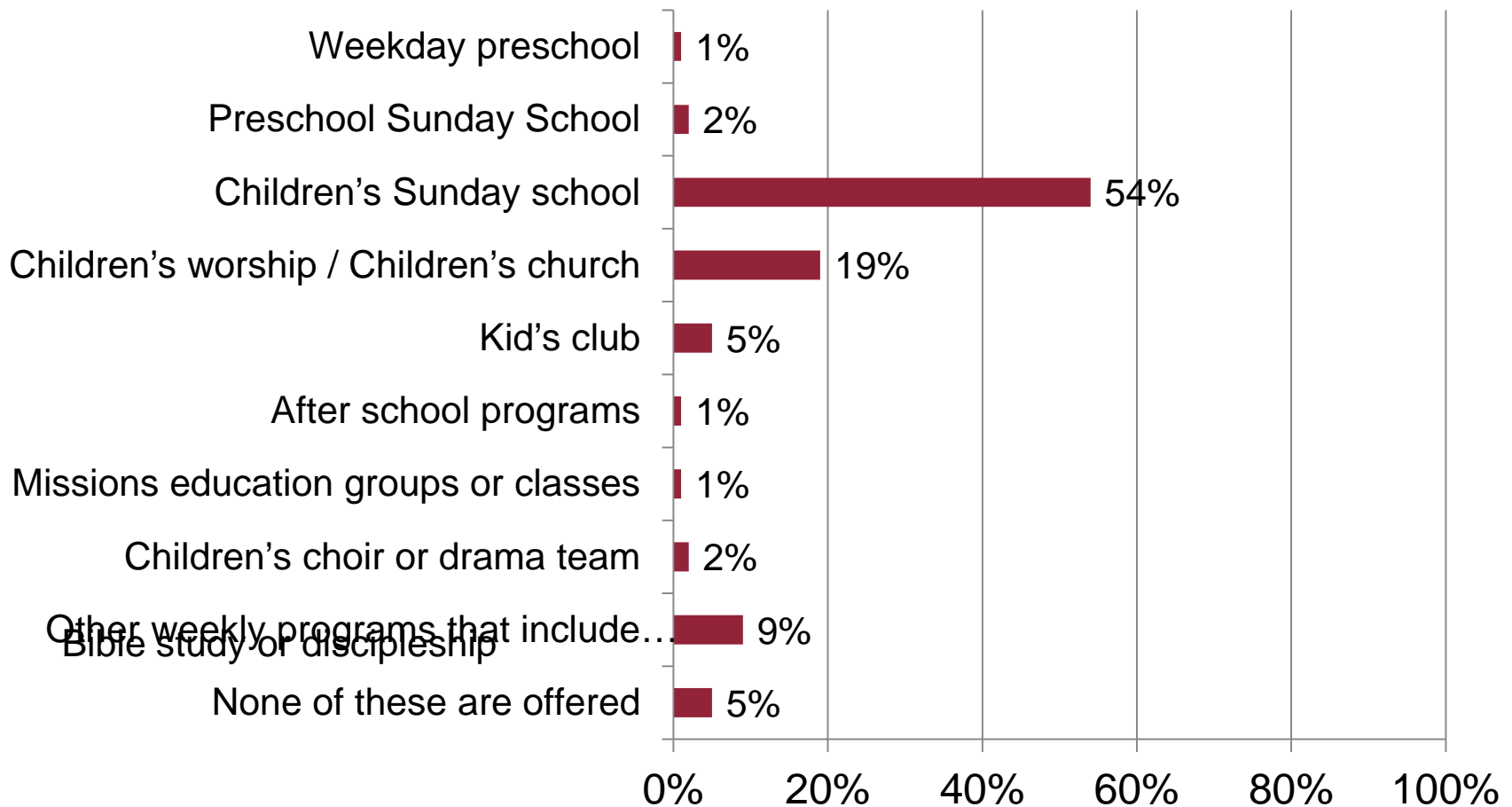
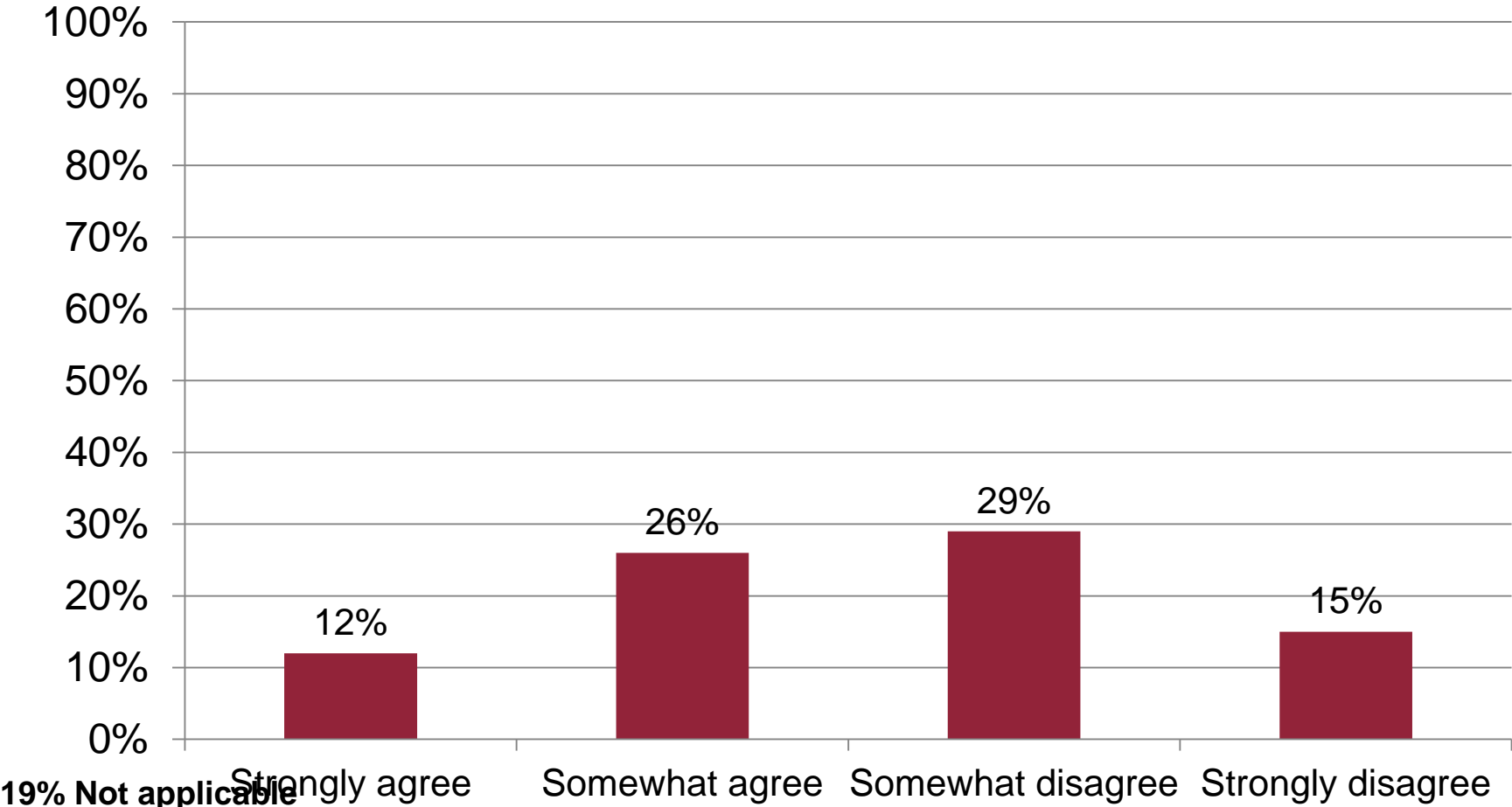


The majority of churches select Children's Sunday school as their Most Important Discipling Ministry for Children²³



Q. "Which one of your church's current ongoing ministries for children do you consider the Most Important Discipling Ministry for Children?" (n=2295)

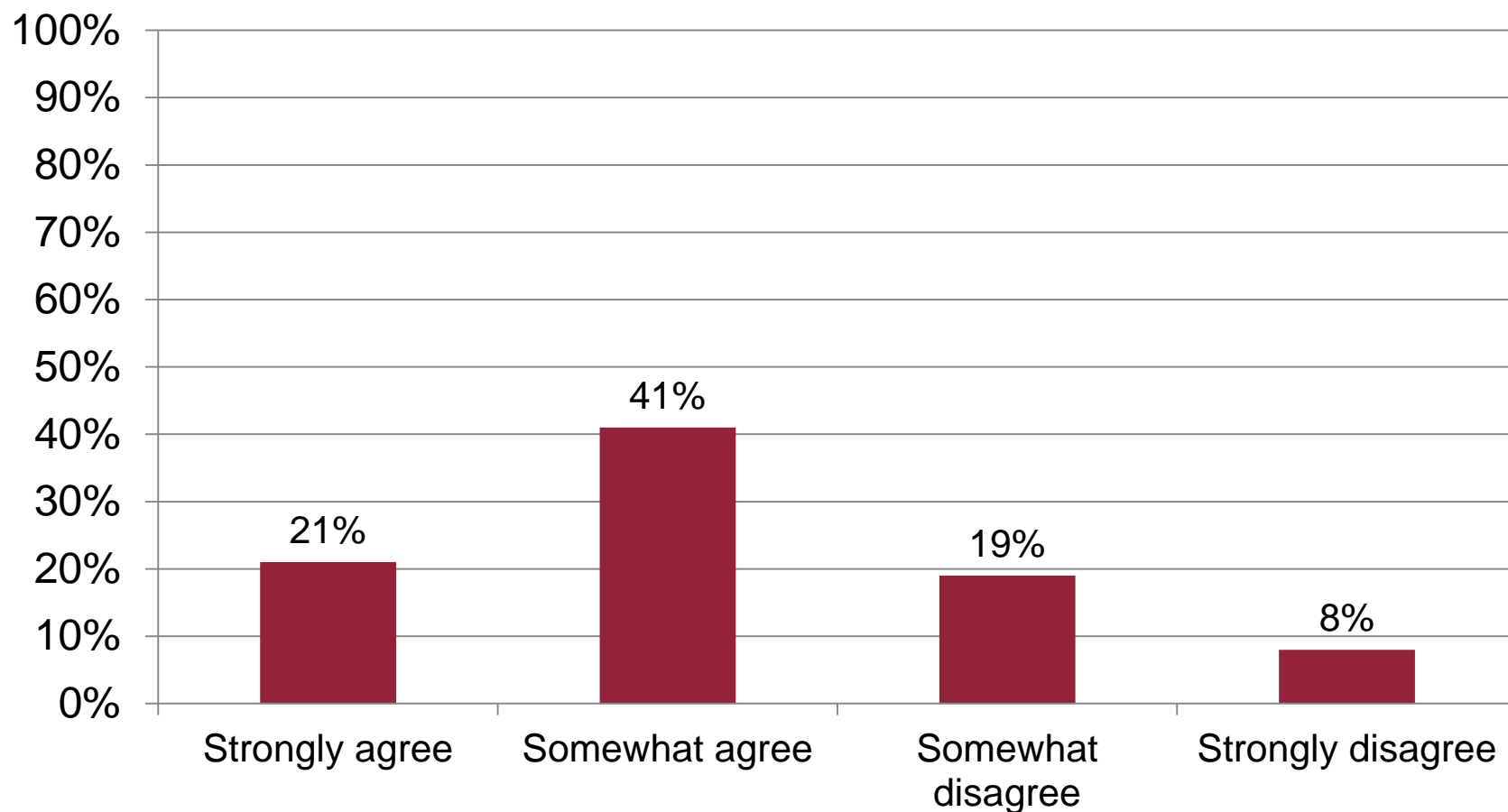
Less than 4 in 10 try to regularly incorporate computer technology in teaching children



Q. "We try to regularly incorporate computer technology in our teaching of children" (n=2169)



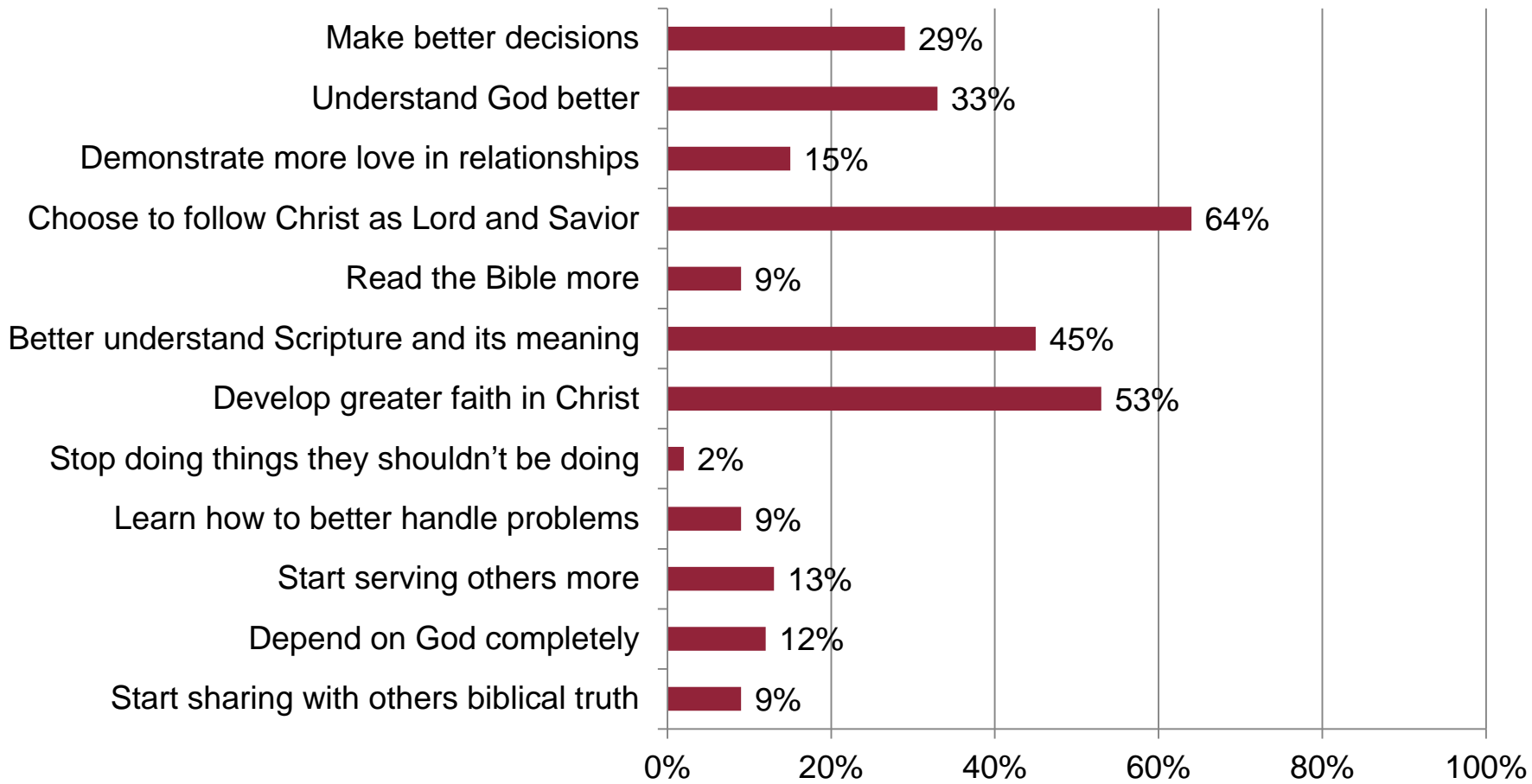
Over 60% regularly incorporate video in the teaching of children

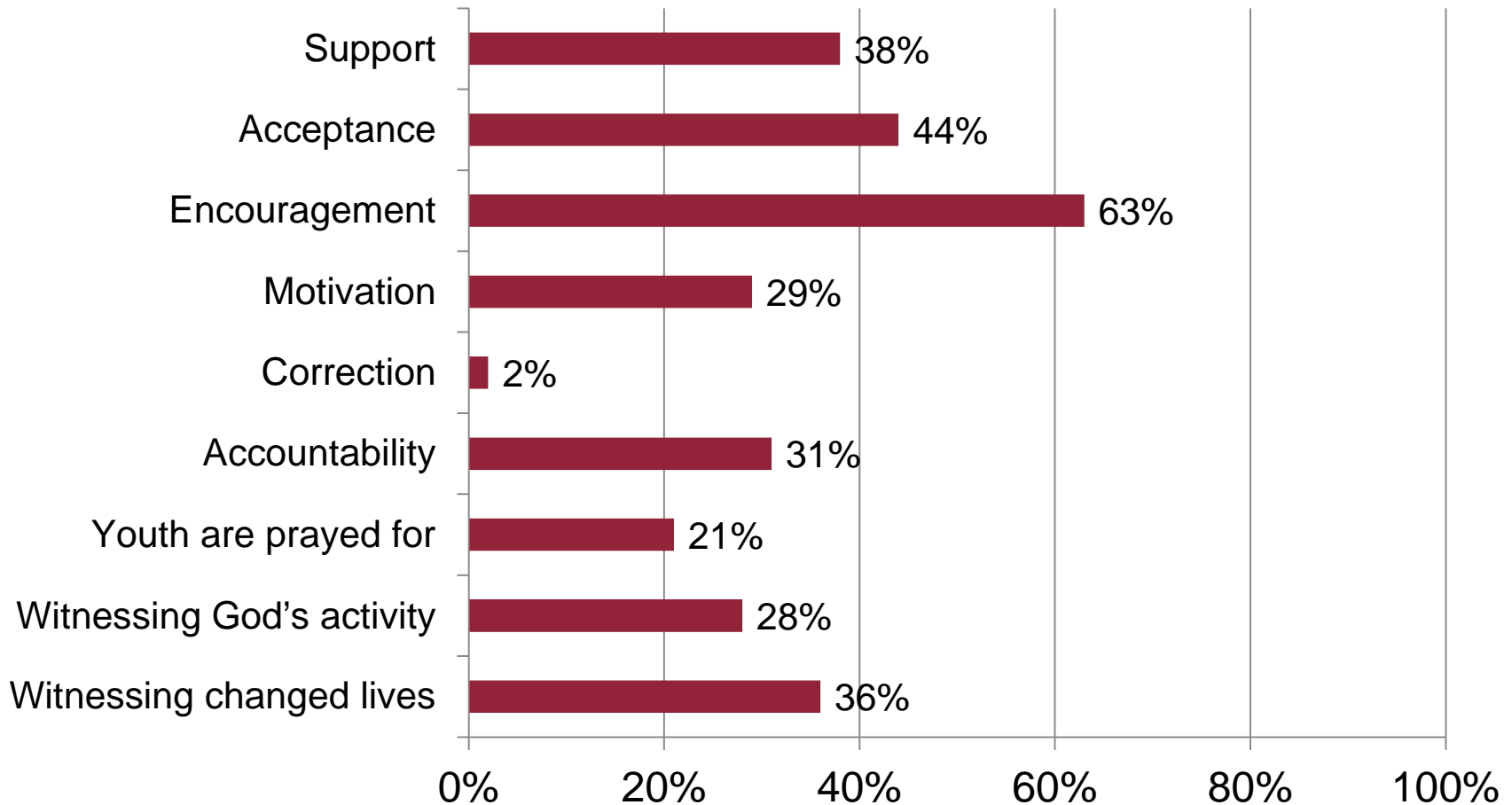

Q. “Which of the following are the **three most desired outcomes** you want for the children in your Most Important Discipling Ministry for Youth?” (n=2070)



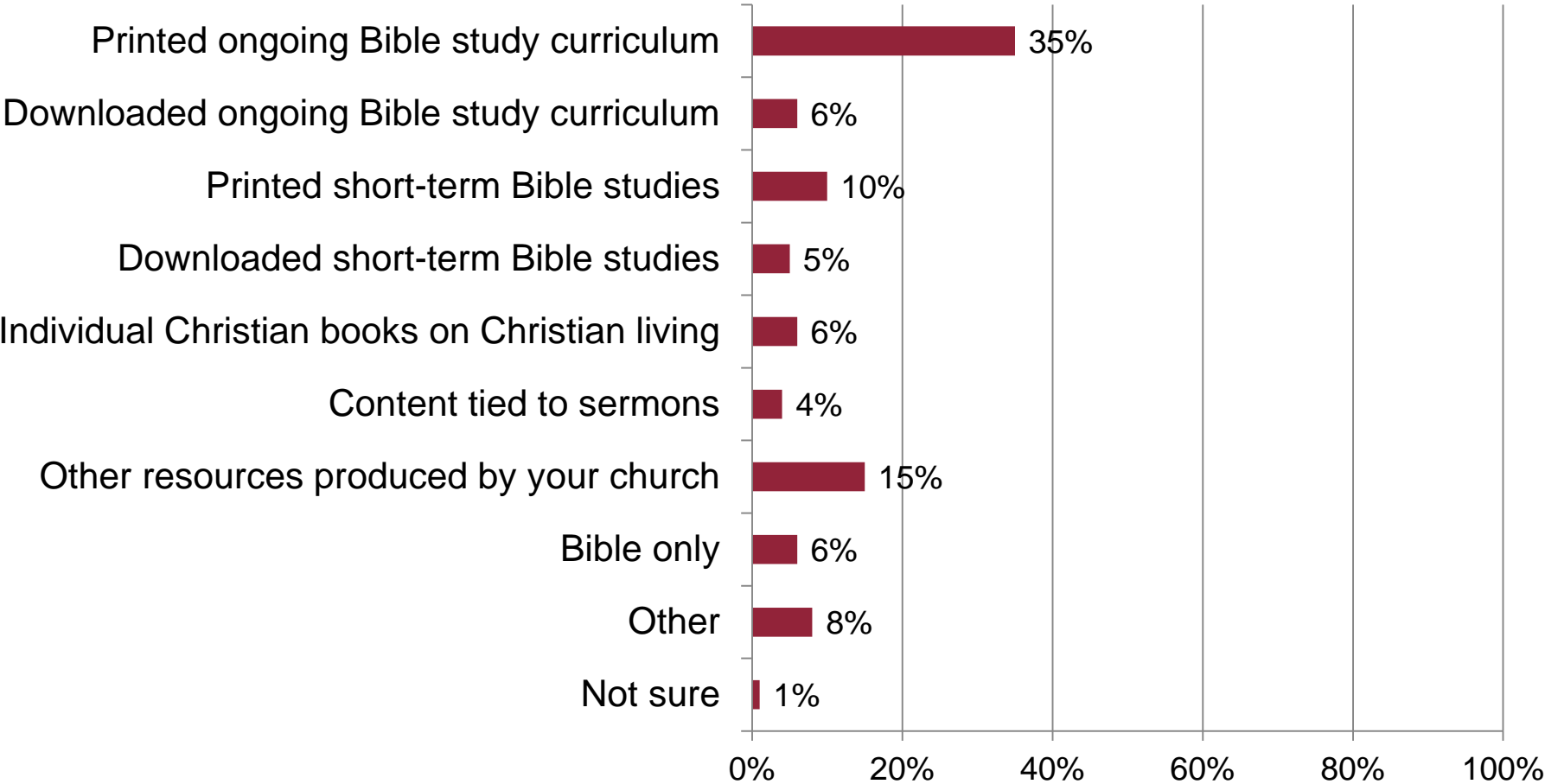
Over 60% selected encouragement as the most desired characteristic of the environment for youth

Q. "Which of the following are the **three** most desired characteristics of the environment you want for your Most Important Discipling Ministry for Youth?" (n=2070)

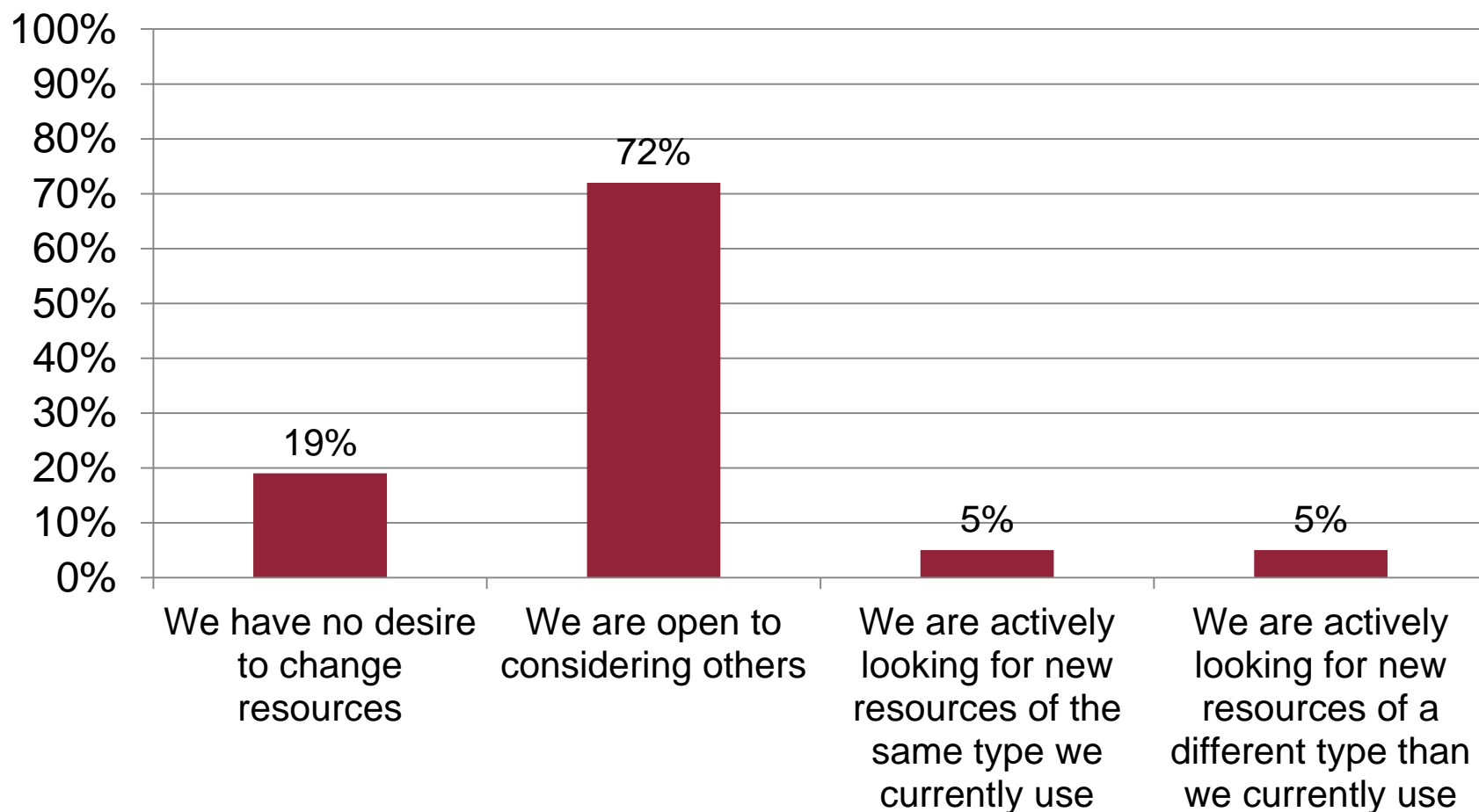
Printed ongoing Bible study curriculum is the most used format for the primary resource



Q. “Which one of the following best describes the primary format of the resources used for your Most Important Discipling Ministry for Youth?” (n=2025)

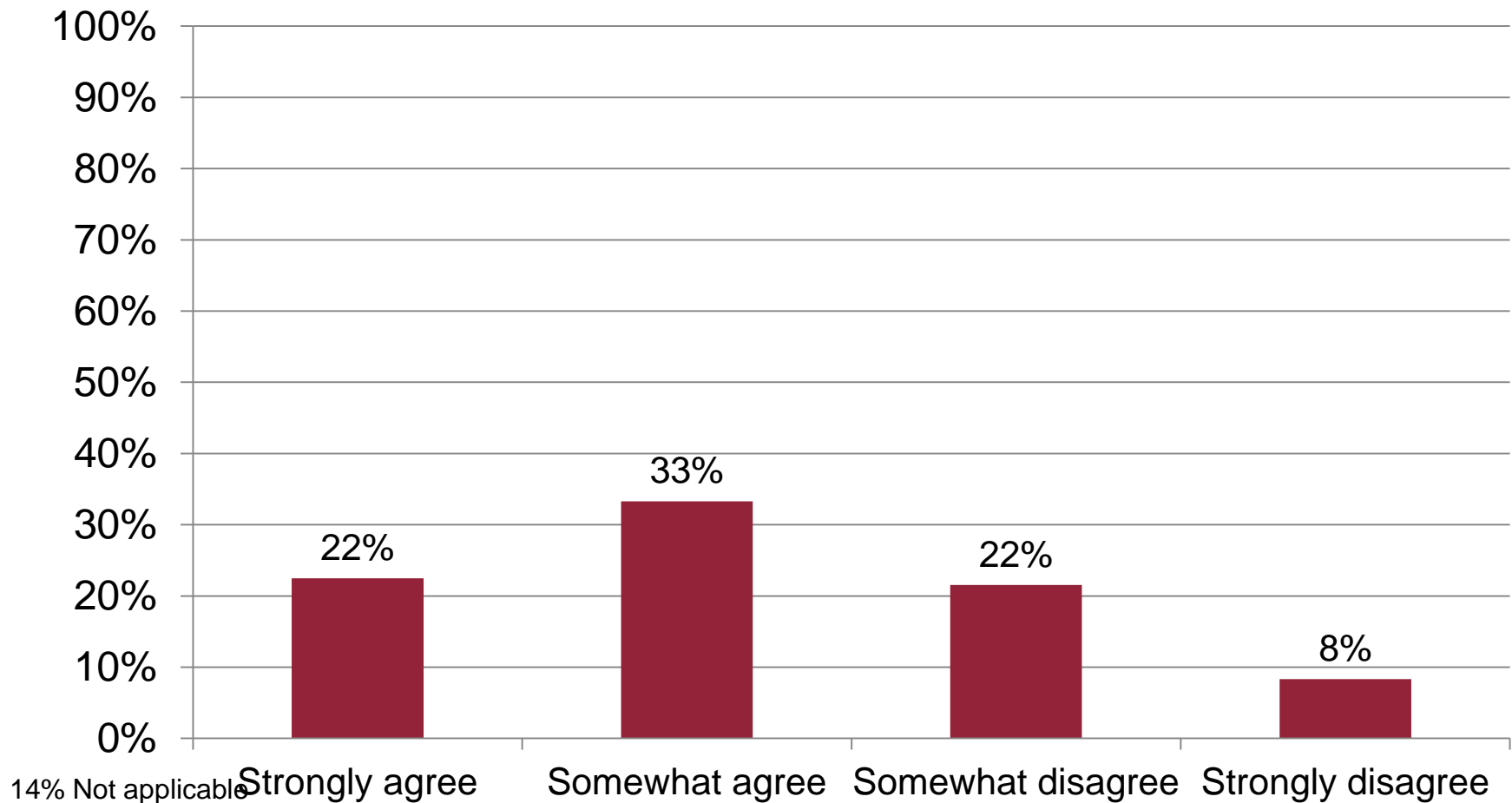


Only 19% have no desire to change discipleship resources used for youth



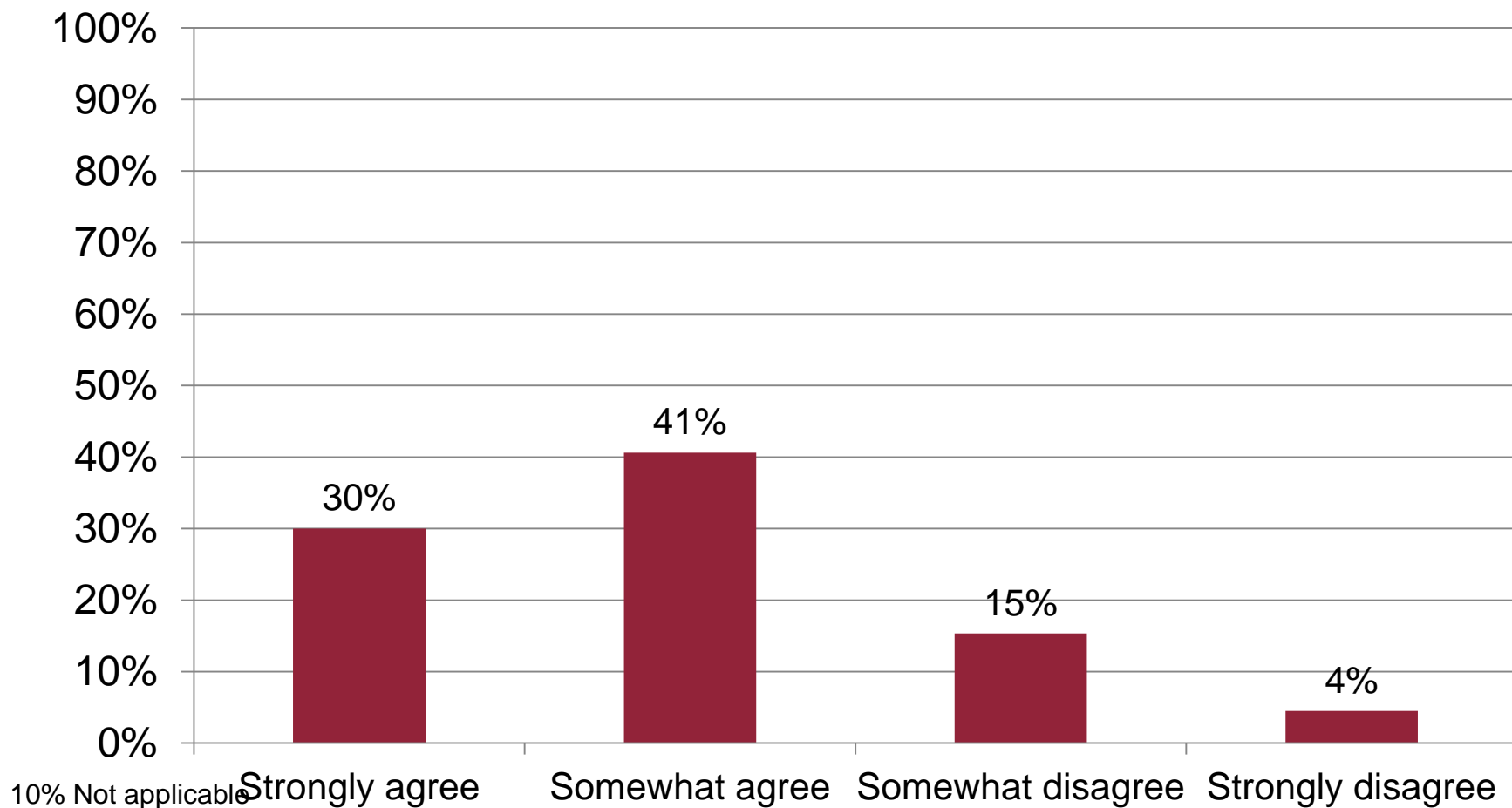
Q. "Which one of the following statements best describes your church's interest in changing the discipleship resources you use for Youth?" (n=2005)

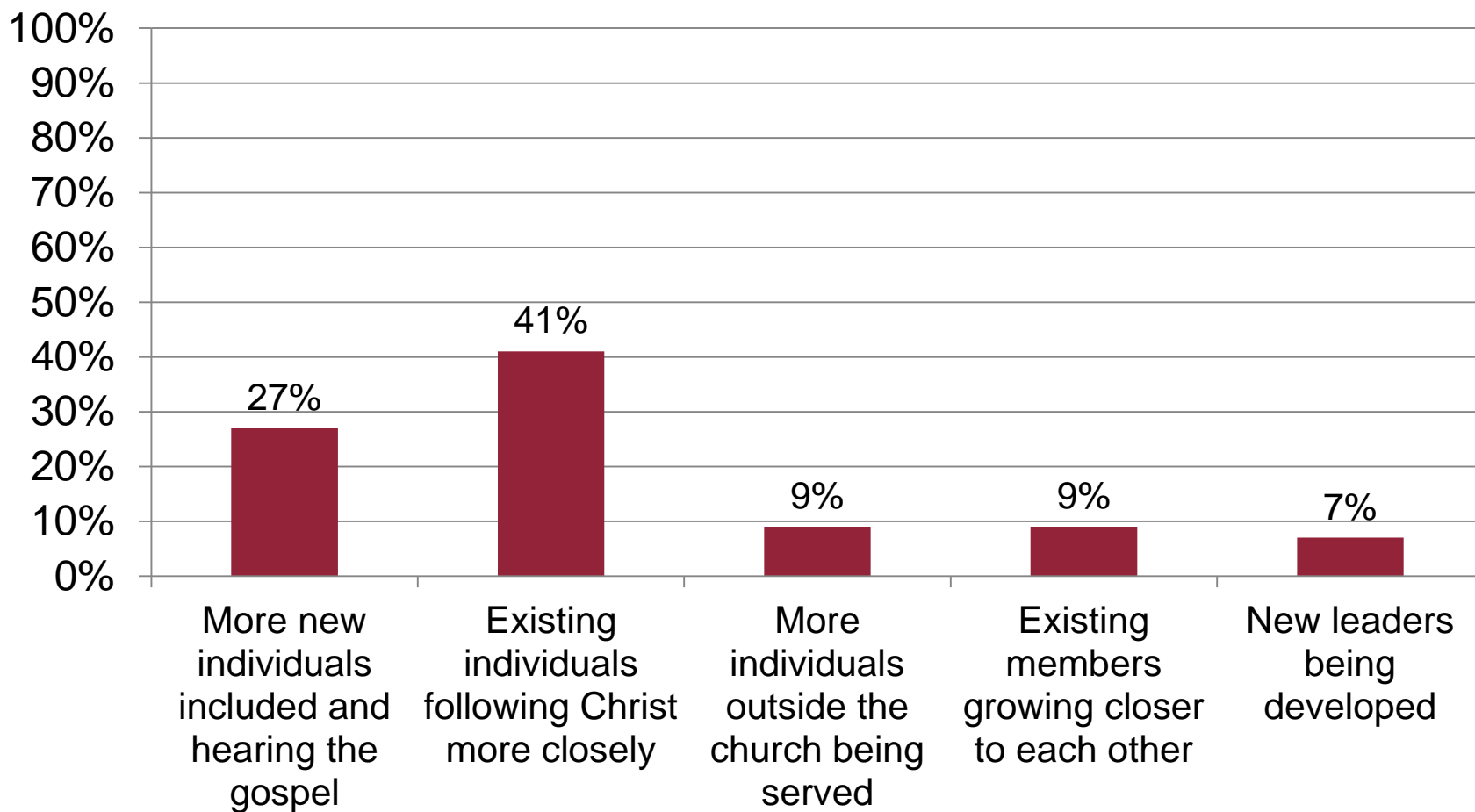

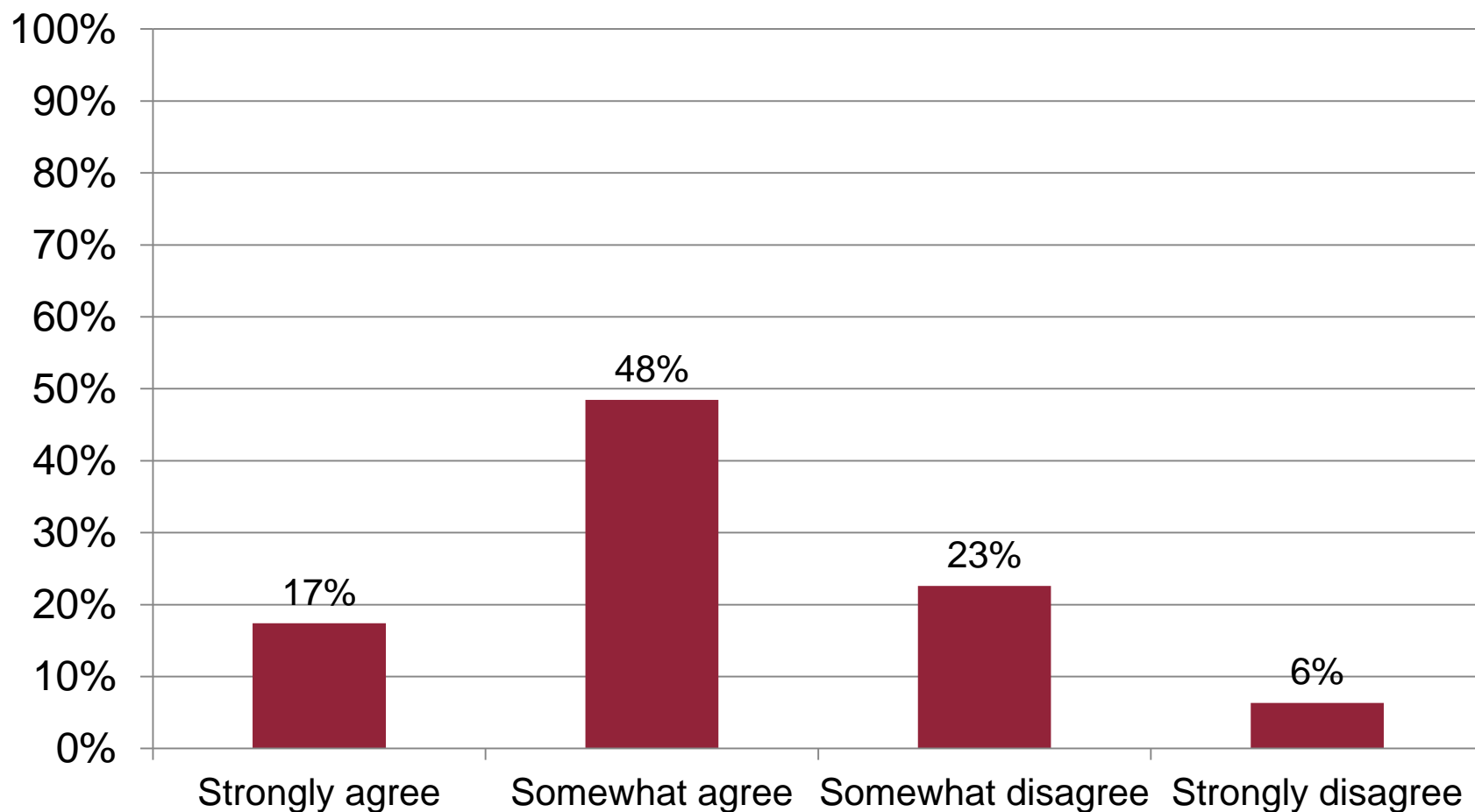
A large majority selected “More new individuals included and hearing the gospel” or “Existing individuals following Christ more closely” as the most valuable outcome of small groups for adults

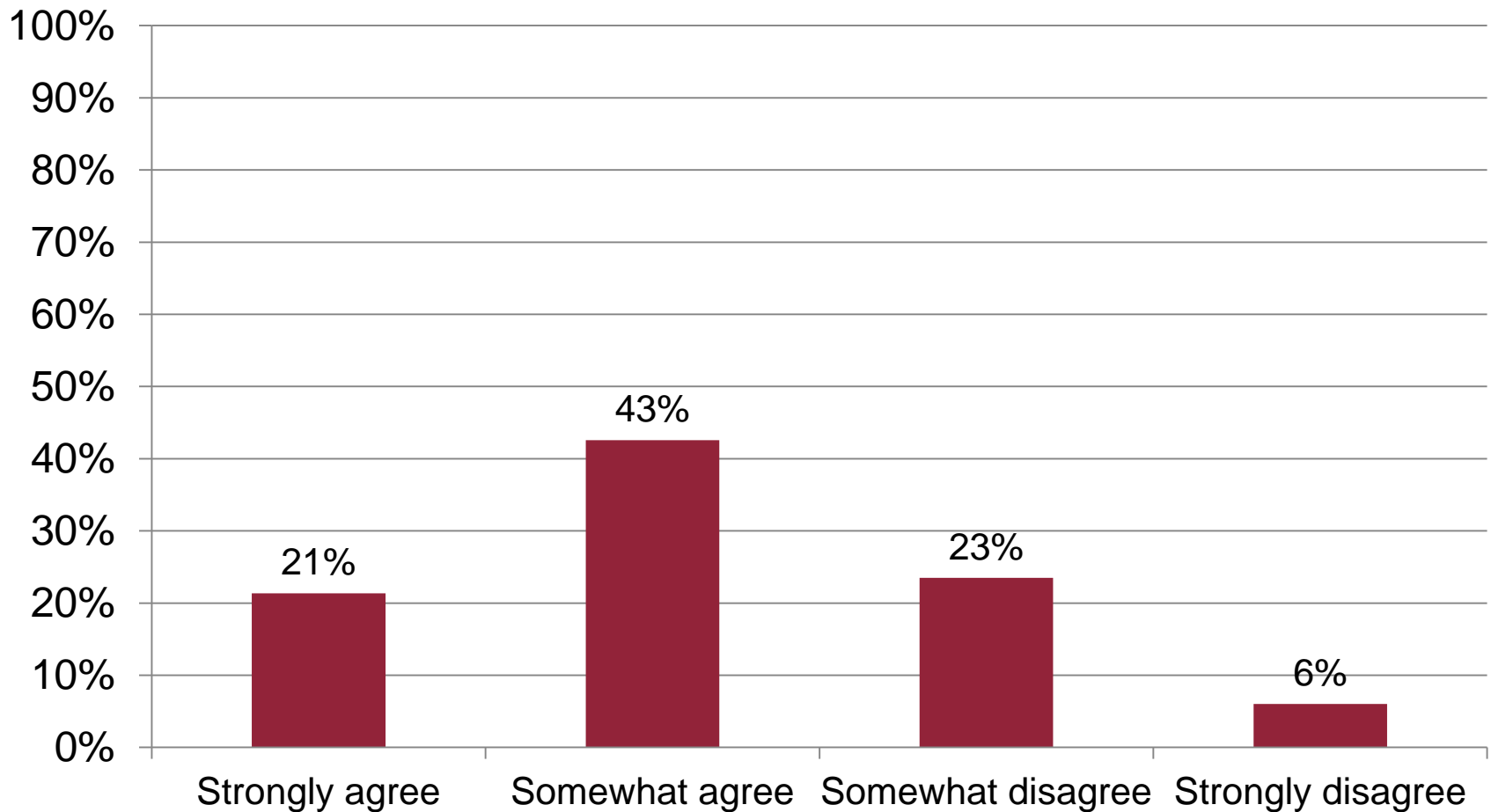
Q. “Which of the following outcomes does your church value most for your small classes or groups for Adults?” (n=2188)

Around 65% have an action or service-oriented approach to spiritual development



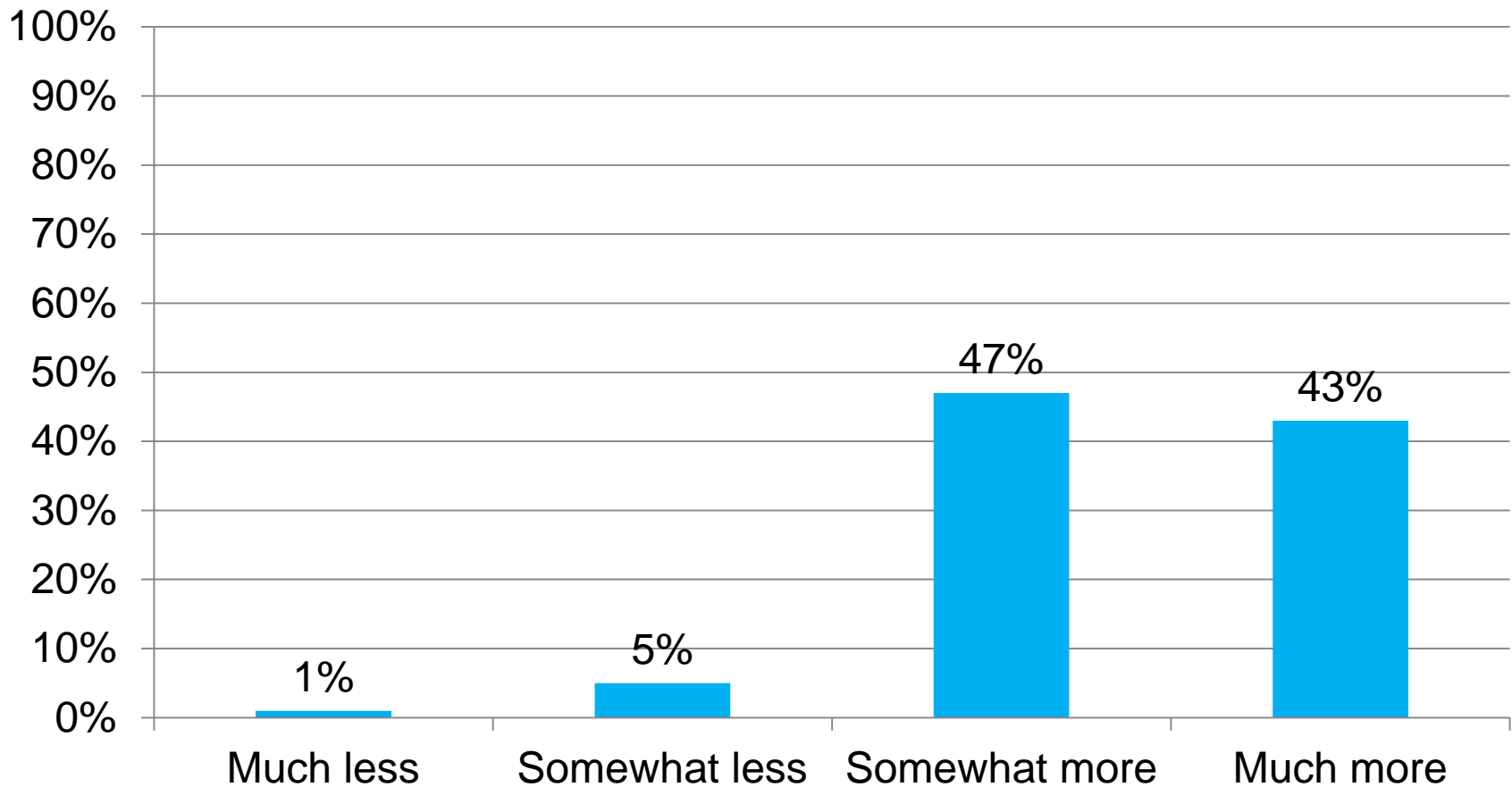

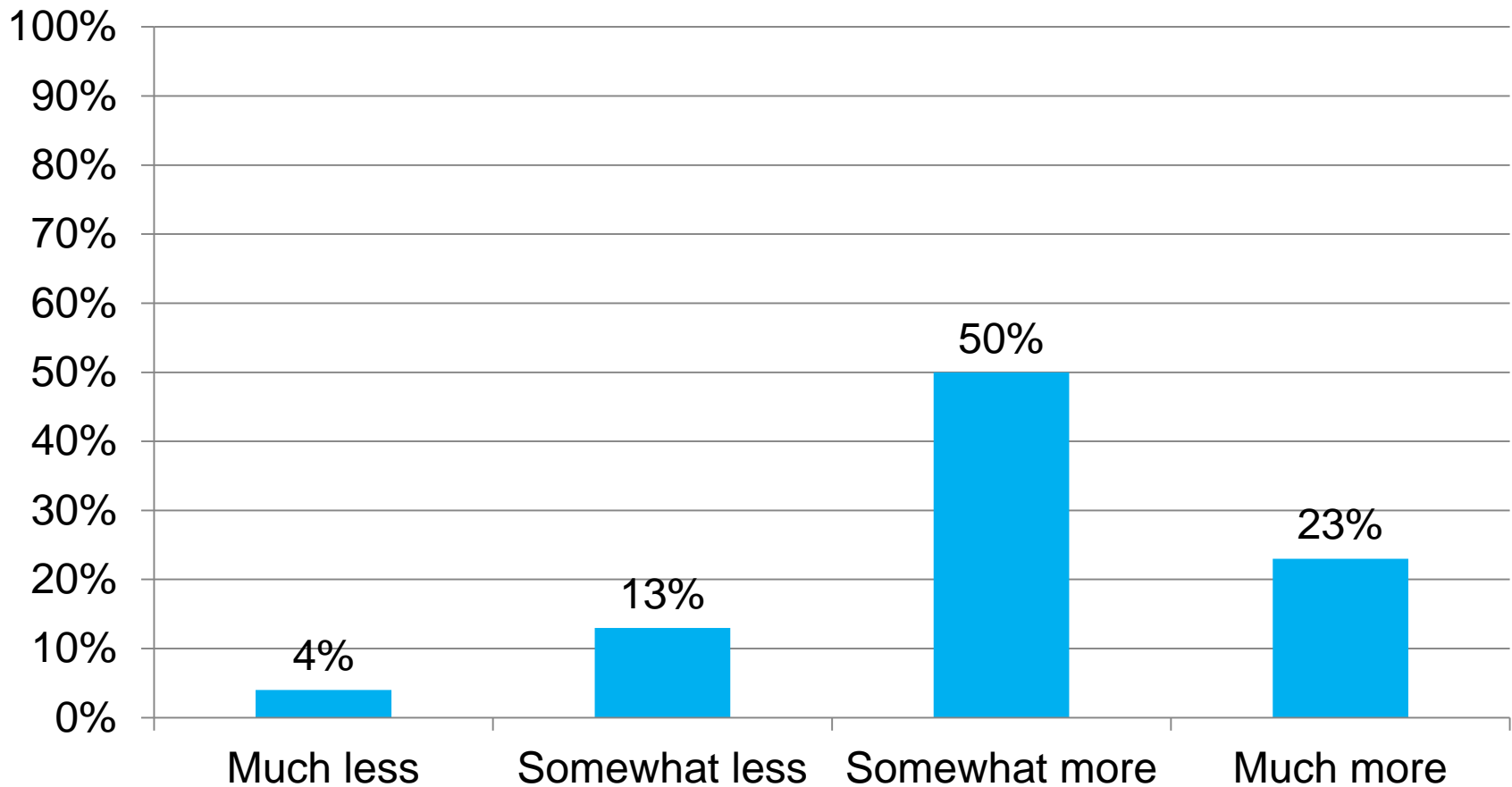
90% of churches are placing more emphasis on people building relationships with those outside the church

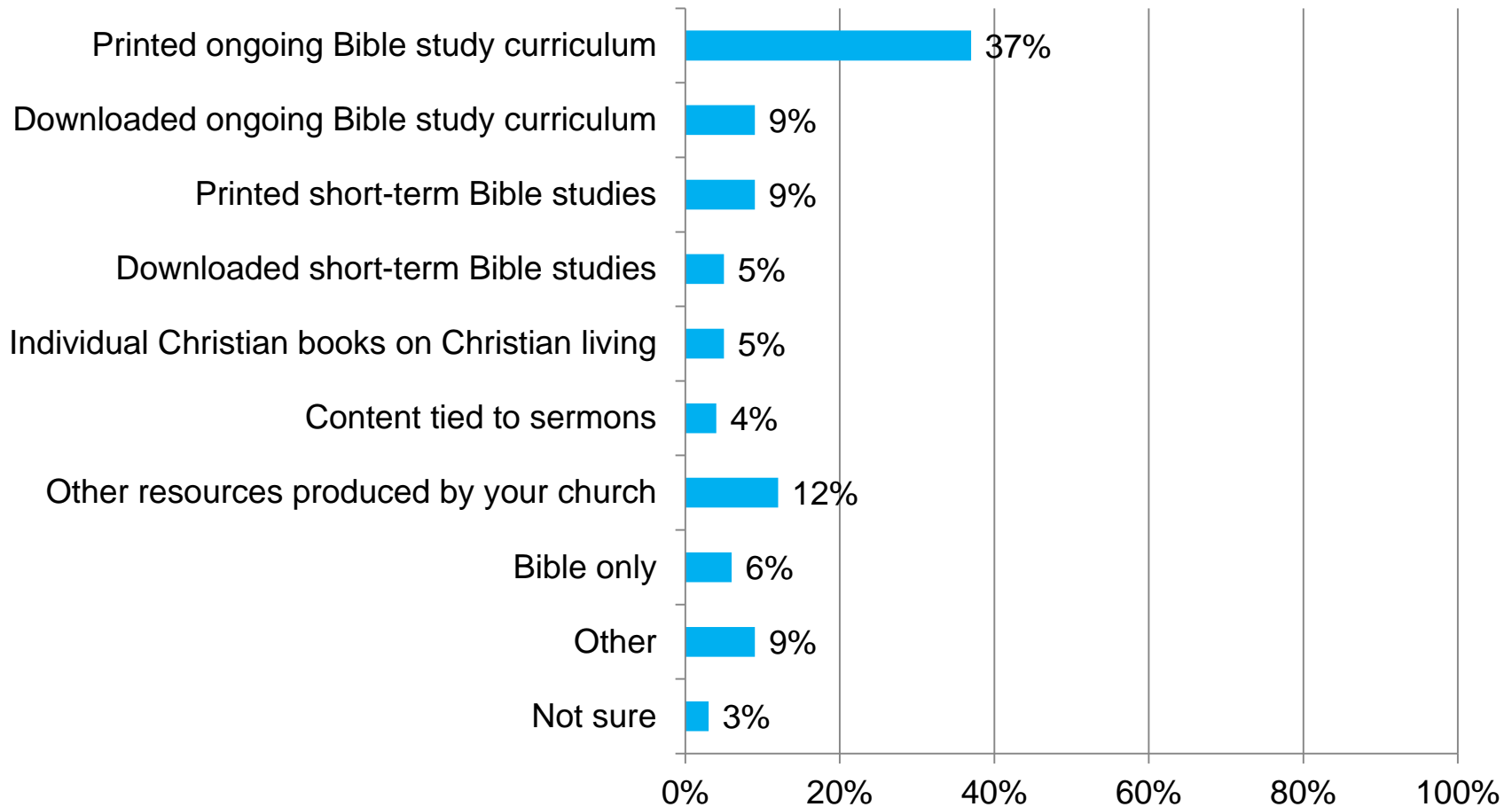
Nearly three-fourths of churches are placing more emphasis on personal Bible study at home

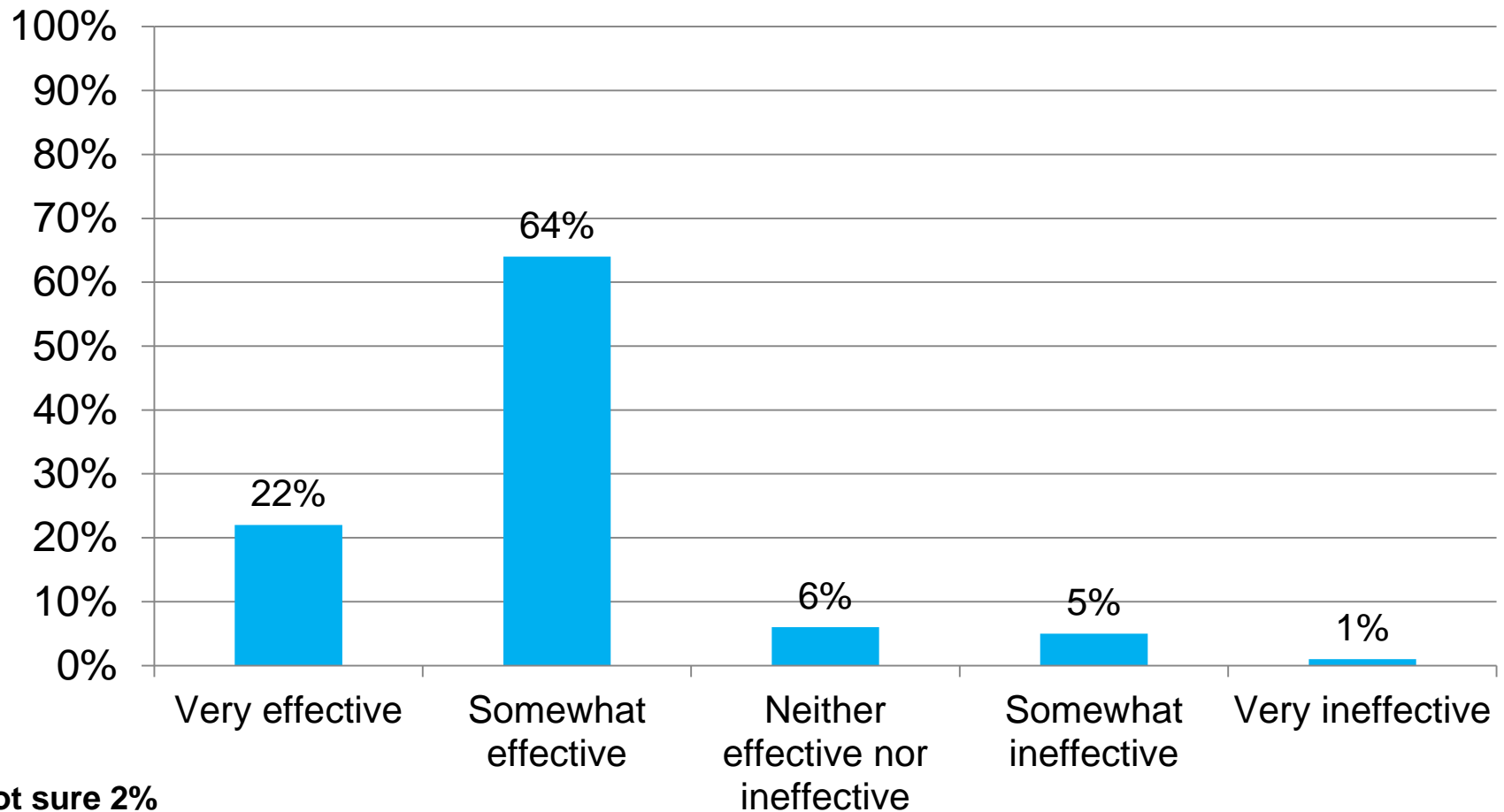
