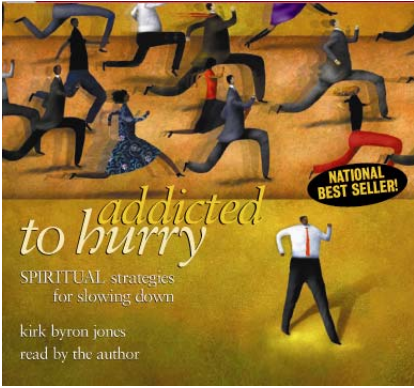


Learning to Slow Down While on the Go
