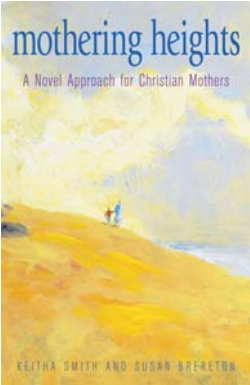


A Unique Look at Motherhood through the Lens of Classic Literary Novels
